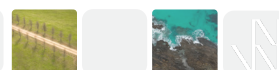

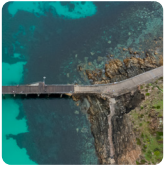

This year's case law review will cover all of the relevant ERD and Supreme Court decisions in the last 12 months including topics such as swimming pool safety, applications to quash deemed planning consents, planning appeals involving a retail fuel outlet (and determining any existing use rights for it), a carport forward of a dwelling, third-party advertisements and a directed refusal involving a State Heritage Place; enforcement notice appeals and civil enforcement proceedings involving unapproved recycling facilities, residential uses and junkyards; contempt of court proceedings; council and third party joinder applications; multiple tree damaging activity prosecutions for regulated trees; an application to access neighbouring land; and a case considering the enforcement of an LMA and its interaction with subsequent development authorisations.
